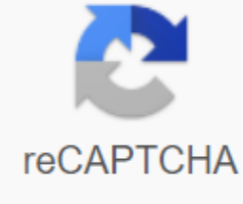

Named after Matthew Rowan, North Carolina governor from 1753 to 1754.Originally, Rowan County had a vast area of indefinite western border. Reductions in its extent began in 1770, when the eastern part was combined with the western part of Orange County to become Guilford County, North Carolina. In 1771, the northeastern part of what remained of Rowan County became Surry County. In 1777, the western part of Rowan County became Burke County. In 1788, the western part of the now much smaller Rowan County became Iredell County. In 1822, the eastern part of the still shrinking county became Davidson County. Finally, in 1836 the part of Rowan County north of the South Yadkin River became Davie County. The 250 Fest celebrates the 250th anniversary of Rowan County that took place in 2003. The South Yadkin forms the county's northern border with Davie County.The southern border is an east-west line that bisects the city of Kannapolis. Major highways interstate 85 pass through the county's southwest and northeast. In the early 2000s, I-85 underwent an extensive winding in the central and northern parts of the county, exiting 68, U.S. 29 Connector north of almost the Davidson County line. A new bridge over the Yadkin River as planned. U.S. Route 70 enters the northwest part of Rowan County, west of Cleveland. It runs southeast of Salisbury, where it follows Jake Alexander Boulevard to the southeast and then connects US 29 North to Main Street. US 70 remains northeast as Main Street and then Salisbury Avenue spencer before crossing the Davidson County.Us. Route 29 forms Main Street in Kannapolis, China Grove and Landis, south of the county. Joins US 70 on Main Street via Salisbury, and Salisbury Avenue in Spencer.U.S. Route 52 is the main artery in the southeastern part of the county, serving the cities of Gold Hill, Rockwell and Granite Quarry. Just before reaching downtown Salisbury, US-52 connects to Interstate 85, which follows the Davidson County. The population density is 255 people per square mile (98/km²). There were 53,980 housing units with an average density of 106 per square mile (41/km²). The racial makeup of the county was 80.02% white, 15.78% black or African-American, 0.33% Native American, 0.85% Asian, 0.03% Pacific Islands, 2.00% other races, and 1.00% two or more races. 4.12% of the population was Hispanic or Latino of any species. It was in 49,940 households, 32.40% of which had children under the age of 18, 54.80% were married together, 11.90% had a female household without a husband and 28.90% were non-family, 24.70% of all households were individuals, and 10.20% were single, 65 years of age or older. The average household size was 2.52 and the average family size 2.98.In in the county the population was 24.70% under 18, 9.10% 18-24, 29.80% 25 44 years, 22.50% between 45 and 64 years, and 14.00% 65 years of age or older. The median age was 36 years. One in 100 women had 97.60 men. For every 100 women aged 18 and over, there were 95.30 men. The median income per household in the county was \$37,494, and the median income for a family was \$44,242. The median earnings for men are \$31,626, while women's median earnings are \$23,437. The per capita income in the county was \$18,071. Around 8.10% of families and 10.60% of the population were below the poverty line, including 13.70% of under-18s and 11.40% of over-65s. Winery industry rowan county is also notable for its winemaking. Near Salisbury is the famous Old Stone Vineyard and Winery, built by members of the Cruse family in 1943. The winery is one of the largest in the state producing quality muscadine and French recipe wines. The winery is also the historic site of the Old Stone House built by German immigrant Michael Braun in 1766 and the Beth Sadeh Synagogue, the only Sephardic Jewish synagogue in North Carolina.
